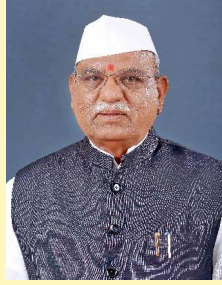

For the last 03 years, the AUK is focusing to achieve quality, excellence and relevance in Agricultural Education, Research, Extension and Training with stakeholders-centric approach in targeted manner. I am delighted to present the publication “Agriculture University, Kota: Pacing Ahead”, which encapsulates the new initiatives and achievements of the University of past three years. Since October 2022, there is a remarkable improvement in the growth and development of the University with better realization of organizational mandate and vision.

This document showcases the several new initiatives and accomplishments as obtaining 2F Certificate of UGC; being first in Rajasthan to implement 6th Deans Committee Report based on NEP-2020; ICAR accreditation of College of Agriculture, Kota along with B. Sc. Ag. (Hons.), 03 PG and 02 Ph.D. programmes; received approval for opening State Institute of Food Technology, Entrepreneurship and Management (SIFTEM) at Sawai Madhopur; increased students' enrolment to 3,000 (26%); invited 16,200 school students & teachers of 9-12th classes to visit various units of AUK; regular organization of “Kulpati-Vidhyarthi Sanwad” in all the constituent Colleges for mentoring 1,148 students.

Besides, received approval for new Centre of ICAR-AICRP on Fruits (Sweet Orange & Mandarin) as the mandate crops at the College of Horticulture & Forestry, Jhalawar; 10 new varieties developed/notified and 89 new improved technologies included in PoP of the State for boosting the productivity of the crops; and the University has signed 28 MOUs for promoting research, education, extension and training.

I am deeply grateful to Hon'ble Governor of Rajasthan for appreciating work of the University in the development of adopted villages Kanvas and Anwa under University Social Responsibility (USR) Programme for three consecutive years i.e. 2022 -2024. AUK has formulated and implemented Training Policy for promoting competency-based training for all categories of employees. It is noteworthy that 100% staff of the University has been trained under this Policy within 13 months. Executive Summary

Agriculture University, Kota (AUK) came into existence on **14th September, 2013**. During last three years, University has expedited its all the academic and scientific programmes so as to achieve quality, excellence and relevance in agricultural education, research, extension and training with stakeholders-centric approach. University has taken several new initiatives and achieved remarkable milestones in all the spheres and significantly contributing in the growth and development of agriculture for the betterment of the farming and scientific communities and other stakeholders of the State and the Nation. Major initiatives and accomplishments of the University from October, 2022 to September, 2025 are summarised as under:

1. ACADEMICS

1.1 FIRST TIME IN AUK

- Agriculture University, Kota has obtained 2F Certificate of UGC (2024).
- Number of affiliated colleges increased significantly from 02 in 2021-22 to 13 in 2024-25.
- First in the state to implement the 6th Deans' Committee Report of the ICAR based on the NEP-2020.
- COA, Kota and its UG and PG programmes viz. B.Sc. Ag (Hons.), M.Sc. in Agronomy, Agricultural Extension Education and Genetics & Plant Breeding and Ph. D in Agronomy and Genetics & Plant Breeding have been accredited by the ICAR till March, 2029.
- Blended Education System has been allowed up to 20 per cent of the syllabus in the Colleges of the University.
- Ph.D. students are given opportunity of teaching UG classes with a remuneration of Rs. 500/- per class.
- Govt. of Rajasthan has sanctioned "State Institute of Food Technology, Entrepreneurship and Management" (SIFTEM), Sawai Madhopur under the Agriculture University, Kota.
- Novel programme "*Kulpati- Vidhyarthi Sanwad*" has been organized regularly in all the constituent colleges for mentoring and guidance of students and 1,148 students in 23 sessions have been motivated by the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor.
- Invited School Students of 9-12th standard along with Teachers to visit various units of the University for creating interest in Agricultural Science and career. More than 16,200 students visited so far.
- Formulated and implemented revised Affiliation Rules for granting affiliation to Government and Private Agriculture Colleges.
- Formulated and implemented modalities and guidelines for permitting various categories of employees of the University to register under M.Sc./ Ph.D. programmes.



1.2 OTHER MAJOR ACADEMIC ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- The student's registration increased to 3,000 (26%) during 2024-25 over to 2023-24 (2,383).
- Sixth, Seventh, and Eighth Convocations of the University were organized and a total of 1,180 degrees were awarded to UG, PG, and Ph.D. students along with 47 gold medals.
- Students received ICAR-SRF (01), ICAR-JRF (12), ICAR-NET (35), National Research Fellow (02) and different fellowships (1,428).
- 142 students were selected as Assistant Professors, SMS, TA, Agriculture Supervisors, etc. in the Government (46) and other various jobs in private sector (96) from the constituent colleges.

2. RESEARCH

2.1 FIRST TIME IN AUK

- Got sanctioned new Centre of ICAR-All India Coordinated Research Project on Fruits (Sweet Orange and Mandarin) at College of Horticulture and Forestry, Jhalawar.
- Provided cash award of Rs. 10,000-20,000 with appreciation certificate to the Scientists for bringing Externally Funded Project costing Rs. 50.0 Lakh and more. As an impact, externally funded projects increased eight-fold in the year 2025 as compared to 2024.
- Provided cash award of Rs. 7,000-10,000 to the first author for publishing quality research paper in Journals of NAAS rating of 7.00 and above. As an impact, publication in >7 and >10 NAAS rated journals increased two times in the year 2025 as compared to 2024.
- University has signed 28 MOUs with the International, National and State level (Public/Private) institutions for accelerating quality and mutual cooperation in education, research, extension and training activities.
- University has introduced Agri-Drone for research and demonstration purposes in the University.

2.2 OTHER MAJOR RESEARCH ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Ten new varieties (Lentil-2; Urdbean-1; Chickpea-6; Linseed-1) developed/ notified.
- Eighty Nine crop improvement, production & protection technologies including horticulture recommended by the University have been included in the Package of Practices of Agro-Climatic Zone-V and III B.
- One Hundred Thirty-Six new externally funded projects got sanctioned under RKVY, Adhoc and Private agencies amounting Rs. 8.72 crore.
- Produced 43,092 quintal quality seeds including 8,241q breeder, 11,453q foundation & certified and 23,398q TL seeds.



- Produced and distributed 3,97,067; 4,06,456 and 4,87,836 numbers of planting materials in the year 2022, 2023 and 2024, respectively which was 80.0, 84.4 and 115.67% more over 2021 (2,26,191).
- About 256 quality research papers have been published in reputed Journals during 2022-25.
- About 6.71 ha land encroached at MAF, Ummedganj, Kota has been taken into possession after 31 years and appropriate fencing has been done.

3. EXTENSION

3.1 FIRST TIME IN AUK

- Hon'ble Governor, Rajasthan appreciated efforts of the University in the development of adopted villages Kanvas and Anwa under University Social Responsibility (USR) for three consecutive years i.e. 2022 to 2024.
- Established Common Incubation Centre (Rs.3.0 crores) for Coriander, Garlic processing and Bakery at KVK, Kota.
- Installed an outdoor LED display at the main gate of the University to share University's activities, weather information and advisory among farmers and other stakeholders throughout day-night.
- New Projects of Rs. 230.52 Lakh got sanctioned from DST and NITI Ayog at KVK, Anta (Rs. 91.12 Lakh) and Karauli (Rs. 139.40 Lakh), respectively.
- Six bilingual booklets on “Successful Agripreneurs” were published by the University Krishi Vigyan Kendra: Kota, Anta-Baran, Bundi, Jhalawar, Sawaimadhopur and Hindaun City- Karauli.
- A Handout “कृषि विश्वविद्यालय, कोटा: मुख्य उपलब्धियां एवं कृषि क्षेत्र में शिक्षा एवं रोजगार के अवसर” for school students to attract the talents towards agricultural education and career was published and distributed to 2,500 student visitors.

3.2 OTHER MAJOR EXTENSION ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Regular publication of “*Abhinav Krishi*” and “*Krishi Panchang*” covering newly recommended technologies and university activities.
- Organized 880 (434 On-campus and 446 Off-campus) capacity development programmes for 30,011 farmers, farm women and stakeholders.
- Conducted 19,198 FLDs for demonstration of latest technologies at farmers' fields in 8,522 ha area with 12 to 38 per cent higher yield and returns.
- University facilitated 21 FPOs through technical support.



- University successfully organized “*Viksit Krishi Sankalp Abhiyan (VKSA)*” during 29th May to 12th June, 2025. Fourteen (14) teams of scientists reached out to 630 villages, benefiting a total of 1,64,807 farmers and farm women.

3.3 ENTREPRENEURSHIP AND STARTUPS

- University has successfully empowered 1,081 aspiring partners through 43 skill-based training and support. Out of them, 333 partners established their enterprise units and net earned up to 12.00 lakh annually.
- Entrepreneurs with high income (> ₹5.0 Lakh annually) increased from 10.00 per cent before enterprise to 54.62 per cent after establishment of enterprise.
- Entrepreneurs with high employment (>250 Man-days annually) increased from 8.46 per cent before enterprise to 43.08 per cent after establishment of enterprise.

4. TRAINING

4.1 FIRST TIME IN AUK

- Formulated and implemented the “Training Policy of Agriculture University, Kota” first of its kind in the State and 100% staff of the University has been trained under this policy within 13 months of its implementation.
- Under AUK Training Policy, the training programmes of three weeks on “Common Induction cum Orientation” for 48 non-teaching staff including 38 newly appointed staff; one week on “Farm and Laboratory Management” for 25 technical staff including 12 newly appointed staff; one week on “Advanced Administrative and Financial Management” for 44 non-teaching staff including 20 newly appointed staff; one week on “Farm and Laboratory Management” for 20 technical staff; one week of special training programs on “Capacity Enhancement of Supporting Staff” for all 32 Class IV employees and one week on “Automobile Maintenance, Road Safety and Behavioral Skills” for all 17 drivers were organised by the university.
- Four days training programme on “Developing winning research project proposals and scientific paper writing” was conducted for 44 Scientific staff of the University.
- Four days training programme on “Administrative and financial management for senior officers of Agriculture University, Kota” for 38 Senior Officers was organised.
- Organising one month training on “Common Induction Cum Orientation Programme for Newly Recruited Teaching Staff (Professor, Associate Professor/ Sr. Scientist and Head, Assistant Professor, Assistant Librarian and SMS)” from 20th August to 20th September, 2025. Forty-three new recruited teaching staff undergoing training within one and a half month of their recruitment.



4.2 OTHER MAJOR TRAINING ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- College of Horticulture and Forestry, Jhalawar organized 21 days ICAR Winter School on "Recent Advances in Hi-tech Farming" during 04-24 January 2023 in which 19 participants participated from 9 states.
- Two days Interaction-Cum-Training programme was organised on Biomass management and its utilization. Training cum exposure visit for Biomass Management was also carried out at Biomass Management and Utilization unit of ICAR-IARI, New Delhi on 14-15th June, 2023 in which Director Research along with 18 scientists/officers/farm in-charges of the University participated.

5. ADMINISTRATIVE INITIATIVES

5.1 FIRST TIME IN AUK

- Formulated and implemented Guidelines for Revolving Fund Utilization; Guidelines for College Students Fund Management; Guidelines for Seed, Processing and Marketing and Guidelines for Cadre-wise Entitlement of Furniture.
- Designed & developed bilingual website of the AUK for the benefit of all categories of stakeholders.
- Designed & developed bilingual Newsletter of the AUK for the benefit of scientific community as well as all categories of stakeholders.
- Formulated and implemented awards for Best Teacher/ Research Scientist/ Extension Scientist.
- Revised eligibility norms of personal promotion under CAS of non-Ph.D. Assistant Professor from Assistant Professor Stage-I (AL-10) to Stage-II (AL-11) and implemented.
- Granted Old Pension Scheme (OPS) to 157 employees to switch over from NPS and 05 employees from CPF.
- Since establishment of the University (2013), first time write off of old stocks was done in 11 units of AUK.
- Established "Staff Club" for teaching, non-teaching staff of Administration Block and SOC members of AUK.

5.2 OTHER MAJOR ADMINISTRATIVE ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Recruited 42 personnel on various non-teaching posts in the University.
- Recruited 47 personnel on various teaching posts in the University.
- Appointed 03 persons on compassionate ground.
- ACP and MACP benefits were granted to 38 and 16 employees of Class IV, respectively.
- Provided Departmental Promotion to 19 employees including 03 Class-IV employees to Agriculture Supervisor (01) and Clerck Gr-II (02).
- Under the Career Advancement Scheme (CAS), 67 teaching staff were promoted.



- Zero pendency of any type of promotions of staff (Class IV to Professor) of the University.
- Regular full Pension is being provided to 115 retired employees from University Funds.
- 85% of the University's Administrative Block has been made air-conditioned, with an annual savings of over ₹10 lakh through efficient electricity management and the installation of a solar power system.
- University successfully resolved 40 out of 97 long-pending court cases, with 85% success rate in favour of the institution.

5.3 GREEN INITIATIVES

- About 35,852 plants were planted at various units of the University with >95% success rate.
- Established Biomass Management Unit at all the functional units of the University.
- University enhanced its solar energy production capacity by 350 KWA (473% increase), resulting in a 40–45% reduction in the main campus electricity bill.
- Established regular general cleaning system in AUK Campus for creating clean, welcoming, and productive environment for staff, students and visitors.
- Developed and implemented landscaping plan for each Functional Unit for beautification.

6. INFRASTRUCTURE DEVELOPMENT

6.1 FIRST TIME IN AUK

- Construction works of Academic cum Administrative Block, Hostels, Road at College of Agriculture, Hindoli (Bundi) completed in 23 months with outlay of Rs. 16.40 Crore and regular classes started.
- Construction works of Academic cum Administrative Block, Road at CoA, Kota with outlay of Rs. 16.00 Crore to be completed within 2 months.
- Construction Works (3.2 km long distributary, AUK Mall and 600-meter long pucca nala) completed without University expenditure (Total ₹4.03 Crore).

6.2 OTHER MAJOR INFRASTRUCTURE DEVELOPMENT ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Hon'ble Governor of Rajasthan Shri Kalraj Mishra Ji virtually inaugurated a Common Incubation Center, KVK, Kota; two Seed Procuring Units at ARSS, Khanpur and Aklera; an Air-conditioned Dehumidified Seed Storage and Seed Godown at MAF, Kota on 25th June, 2024.
- Organic Waste Management Unit was established at COA, Kota as Experiential Learning Unit for final year Student of B.Sc. (Hons.) Ag. under the Student READY programme.



- 100 farm machinery and implements worth ₹1.22 Crore and 93 laboratory equipment/instruments worth ₹1.43 Crore purchased during 2023-25.
- 25 vehicles (01 Bus, 01 Innova Car, 09 Bolero, 13 Tractor and 01 JCB) worth ₹3.58 Crore were purchased during 2023-25.

7. BUDGET AND RESOURCES GENERATION

- Budget allocations from various funding sources (State Government, ICAR, and others) increased by 22.8% in 2023–24 and 48.7% in 2024–25 compared to ₹49.95 crore in 2022-23.
- The revenue generated from the University farms has increased by 37.66% in the year 2024-25 (₹1021.93 lakh) over 2021-22 (₹742.33 lakh).
- On an average (2022-25), 38% increase in the revenue over 2021-22 (10.30 Crore).

8. AWARDS & RECOGNITIONS

- University staff, students and University supported farmers received 138 awards and recognitions during 2022-25 at various levels.
- On the occasion of Republic Day, Independence Day and foundation Day, Appreciation certificates were given by the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor as 32, 13, 06 and 07 to the Scientific, Technical, Administrative and Supporting Staff, Respectively for their Contributions in the growth and Development of the University.

Agriculture University, Kota (AUK) came into existence on **14th September, 2013** on bifurcation of the Swami Keshwanand Rajasthan Agricultural University, Bikaner and Maharana Pratap University of Agriculture and Technology, Udaipur. During last three years, University accelerated its all-academic and scientific programmes with major focus to achieve quality, excellence and relevance in agriculture education, research, extension and training with stakeholder-centric approach. University has achieved several important milestones in all spheres and significantly contributing in the growth and development of agriculture for the betterment of the farming and scientific communities and other stakeholders of the State and the Nation.

Major initiatives and accomplishments of the University during October, 2022 to September, 2025 are enumerated below:

1. ACADEMICS

1.1 FIRST TIME IN AUK

- Agriculture University, Kota has obtained 2F Certificate of UGC (2024) to be recognised as a legitimate institution under the UGC Act which allows to receive government grants and central assistance and offers enhanced credibility.
- Number of affiliated colleges increased significantly from 02 in 2021-22 to 13 in 2024-25.
- First in Rajasthan to implement ICAR 6th Dean's Committee Report aligned with NEP-2020 for undergraduate streams of Agriculture, Horticulture & Forestry in all the constituent and affiliated colleges *w.e.f.* 2024-25. The key features include multiple entry and exit along with UG- Certificate, UG- Diploma, more emphasis on skill enhancement through incorporation of 10 weeks internship, 20 credits of skill enhancement courses and experiential learning, etc.
- Based on NEP-2020, 6th Deans Committee Report implemented with two-week *Deekasharimbh* programme organized by the constituent and affiliated colleges of the University for the newly admitted first year students of B. Sc. (Hons.) Agriculture,

Horticulture and Forestry. Many activities were conducted for personality development of the newly admitted students.

- National Agricultural Education Accreditation Board of ICAR, New Delhi accredited the College of Agriculture, Umedganj, Kota along with its B.Sc. (Hons.) Agriculture, 03 Master's programmes (Agronomy, Genetics & Plant Breeding and Agricultural Extension Education) and 02 Ph.D. programmes (Agronomy and Genetics & Plant Breeding) for five years up to March, 2029.



ICAR-Peer Review Team visited COA, Kota

- Blended Education System has been allowed up to 20 per cent of the syllabus in the Colleges of the University to improve the quality of education.

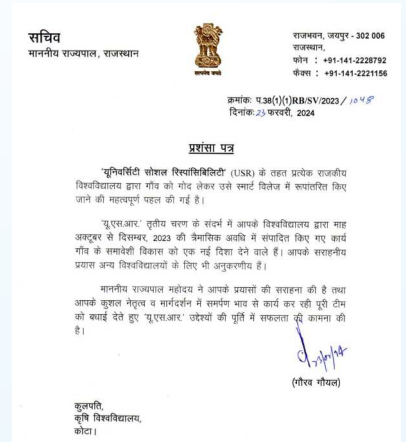
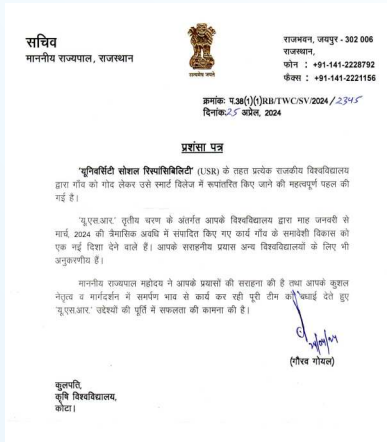

Additionally, the campaign sought to collect real-time feedback from farmers to understand their priorities and challenges, and to provide possible on-the-spot solutions to their problems. Fourteen (14) teams of scientists formed by the KVKs of the University, in collaboration with officials from ICAR Institutions and the State Departments of Agriculture, Horticulture, Forestry, and Animal Husbandry reached out to 630 villages, benefiting a total of 1,64,807 farmers and farm women.

3.3 ENTREPRENEURSHIP AND STARTUPS

- University has successfully empowered 1,081 aspiring partners through 43 skill-based training and support on food processing, beekeeping, protected cultivation, nursery management, goatary, poultry and dairying. Out of them, 333 partners established their enterprise units and earning up to Rs, 12.00 Lakh/annum.
